

## Paddle Wisconsin is an Interactive Map

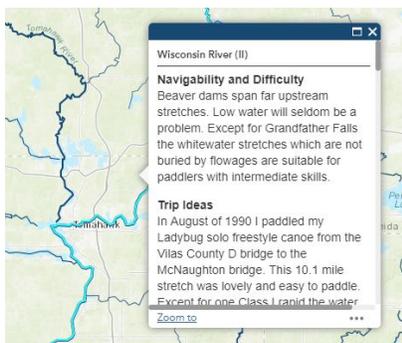
This map operates similarly to Google Maps. You can zoom in and out, and click and drag the map to move around. Paddle Wisconsin is best viewed from a desktop computer.

There are two main clickable “layers” on the map:

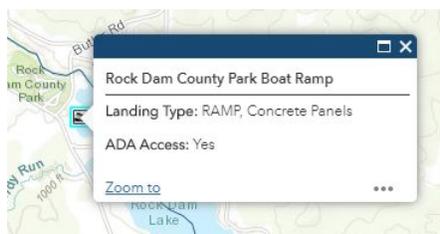
- **Rivers:** Click on a river for information about paddling on that particular river.



- **Boat Landings:** Information to help plan where you might put in and take out.



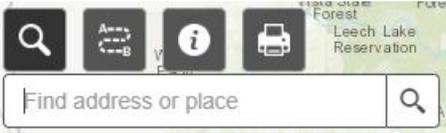
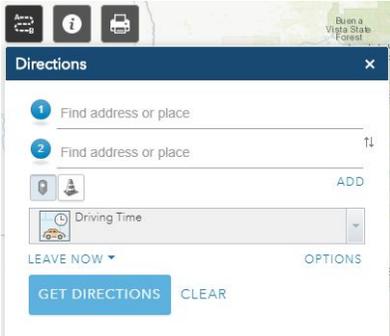
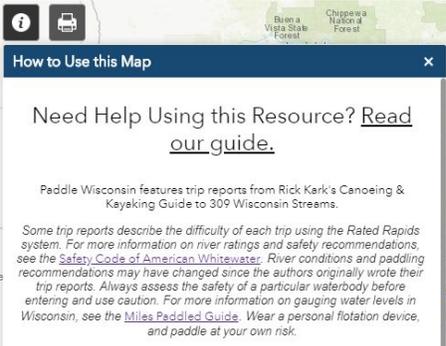
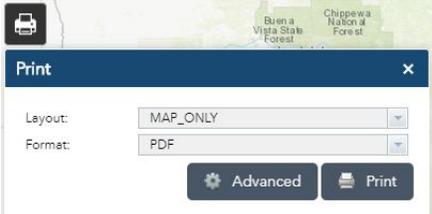
**When you click on a river**, it will become highlighted in light blue, and the pop-up will provide information (if available) from *Rick Kark’s Guide to Canoeing and Kayaking 309 Wisconsin Streams*, as well as links to other resources on that waterway. **To make the pop-up full size**, click the rectangular icon on the top right. Note: Some rivers do not have information.



**When you click on a boat landing icon**, you’ll see a pop-up with information on the type of landing, what it’s made of, and if it is ADA accessible for people with disabilities.

## Other Map Features - What do the Sidebar Icons Mean?

<b>Zoom</b>		These control the zoom options, if you prefer clicking to scrolling the mouse.
<b>Home</b>		This “home” icon will bring the map back to the size that it was when you first opened the page.
<b>My Location</b>		This icon will find your current location on the map. You will have to enable your browser to find your location.
<b>Full Screen</b>		This icon will make the map full screen.
<b>Find a River</b>		<p>This feature allows you to search for a river by name.</p> <div data-bbox="748 884 1295 957" style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; margin: 10px 0;"><input type="text" value="Find a River"/> </div> <p>Just type the stream that you’re looking for in the box that says “Find a River.” It will pull up the trip report automatically!</p>
<b>Toggle Layers</b>		<p>This icon will show you the layers on the map.</p> <div data-bbox="797 1199 1252 1493" style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; margin: 10px 0;"> <b>Toggle Layers</b> <span style="float: right;">x</span> Layers <span style="float: right;">Q [ ]</span> <input type="checkbox"/> Public Boat Access Sites <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Wisconsin Rivers <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Wisconsin Border</div> <p>When you click on the layer icon, you can select which layers you’d like to see. If you don’t want to see the boat landing icons while you’re looking for a river, you can un-check that layer and it will disappear on the map.</p>

<p><b>Find a Place</b></p>		<p>This icon allows you to search for a place or specific address.</p> 
<p><b>Directions</b></p>		<p>This icon allows you to look up directions to a location on the map, to help you plan your paddling trip.</p> 
<p><b>How to Use this Map</b></p>		<p>This icon provides more information about the map, as well as a link to this Instruction Guide.</p> 
<p><b>Print</b></p>		<p>This icon allows you to print the map screen. Select the layout and format that you prefer.</p>
